Leisure Card

All those aged between 6 and 18 years are eligible for a NOK 1000 Leisure Card! The Leisure Card is a gift card that you can use for established, organised recreational activities.

Lillehammer will be a pilot municipality for the Leisure Card. The government's plan is that this will become a national, permanent scheme. Lillehammer is among the municipalities that will test out how the scheme is to be organised and look at the challenges that need to be resolved. We do not know what will happen after our trial period, but we are glad for the opportunity this offers children in Lillehammer.

The Leisure Card is for everyone in the appropriate age group. In August 2021, all those who were born between 2003 and 2015 will receive a card for a value of NOK 1000, to pay for established, organised recreational activities. Next spring, all of those in this age group will receive a new gift card for another NOK 1000. If the activity costs more than this amount, you can use the card to pay for part of the cost, then you must pay the remaining sum yourself. The funds cannot be used to pay other types of expenses, it cannot be paid directly to the family, it cannot be saved from the autumn until the spring and cannot be used on other siblings. Every child in the appropriate age group will receive their own Leisure Card.

Go to: <u>lillehammer.aktiv-fritid.no</u> to see which activities you can take part in using your Leisure Card. You can view the funds available on the child's Leisure Card, and when you have received an invoice for established, organised recreational activities, you can pay for these with the Leisure Card (if the organisation has chosen to take part in the project). Is your activity not on the list? Ask them to contact <u>fritidskortet@lillehammer.kommune.no</u> to join the Leisure Card project!

When you register, you must choose 'Bokmål' as the language – but when you have registered and logged in you can then change this to Nynorsk, English, Somali or Arabic. In the coming months, the platform may be translated into several more languages. In 'Settings' you can change to 'full text' or 'simple text' and there is an option to view symbols that show the content of individual activities. Information that the various organisations add in their overview will however be in Norwegian.
